

**Columbia College – Missouri (Lake County IL Campus)**  
**Transfer Planning Guide – CRIMINAL JUSTICE MAJOR**  
 Use in tandem with CC-MO general transfer guide

All grades must be a “C” or better for transfer

Open enrollment for transfer to CC-MO

No courses are required for admission to the Criminal Justice major; however, the courses noted below are required to earn the baccalaureate degree and may be taken at CLC.

Students are recommended to have completed the AA or AS with the following coursework:

Communications:	ENG 121, ENG 122, CMM 121
Mathematics:	MTH 222
Physical/Life Sciences:	follow CLC general education requirements
Humanities/Fine Arts:	PHI 125, follow CLC general education requirements
Social/Behavioral Sciences:	one of the following prefixes: (PSC, PSY, SOC), total 9 hours for CLC
Electives:	CIT 120; CRJ (117 or 124), 121, 122, (123 or 229), 216, 221, 222; additional CRJ courses will meet CC-MO Social/Behavioral and will be reviewed for electives

If not completing the AA/AS at CLC, it is **recommended** that you include the following courses for the Criminal Justice core and for general education. The courses noted will also meet requirements for students completing the AAS degree.

General Education (some Criminal Justice Core included):

- ENG 121, 122
- CIT 120
- CMM 121
- MTH 122 or higher course (MTH 140/141 not eligible)
- 6 hours: (include HST 121 or 122): HST 121, 122, 221, 222
- Arts/Humanities (6 hours): select from: ART 121; (ART 240 or HUM 121 or 122)\*, (ART 241 or 242); ENG 223, 225, 226, 228\*, 229, 241, 243, 244\*; MUS 224; PHI 121, 122, 221\*; SPA 121, 122
- Social/Behavioral: one course (PSY 121 or SOC 121\*), 2 CRJ courses
- PHI 125
- Science/Math: 5 hours\*\*\*: additional MTH and/or select from: (BIO 111 or 161), BIO 120, (CHM 120 or 121), (ESC<sup>1</sup> 120 or 121 or 140), (PHY 111 or 121)

Criminal Justice Core:

- CRJ (117 or 124), 121, 122, (123 or 229), 216, 221, 222
- additional CRJ courses will be reviewed for electives

\*course meets the Multicultural requirement

\*\*two courses needed; (both science) or (one math and one science)
