**Admission Requirements**

- Submit a completed Admissions Application and application fee of \$60.00
- All Official transcripts must be sent directly to Chamberlain from your school. No transcripts can be hand-delivered, even if they are sealed. (ALL applicants regardless of how many credit hours have been completed must send an official high school transcript, ACT scores, and transcripts from all colleges attended)
- Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 – High School and College or GED score of 551
- Minimum ACT score of 21 or minimum SAT score of 990
- There is no minimum number of transfer credits required before a student can transfer in. If an applicant has over 36 hours (does not include developmental coursework) of college credit completed at the time of application, the Admissions Committee will look primarily at the college GPA. If an applicant has less than 36 hours of college credit at the time of application, the Admissions Committee will look primarily at the HS GPA.
- If you have taken ANY *Nursing* courses or A&P courses, you **MUST** submit syllabi for these courses
- Admissions Interview with an Admissions Advisor
- Written Essay (After you apply, Chamberlain will send you an essay request via email for you to complete)
- Entrance Exam (The NLN exam is not required; applicants will take Chamberlain's own entrance exam.)
- Lastly, if advised by a Chamberlain Advisor, student might need to write letter explaining low GPA or grades
- Students may be admitted for the Fall, Spring, or Summer semesters

**Transfer Credit**

For a course to be considered for transfer, an official transcript demonstrating the completion of the course(s), with a grade of C or better, must be submitted to the Registrar to verify the course content and to ensure its consistency with Chamberlain requirements. A statistics course must be taken at a four-year institution to be accepted for credit. Science courses older than 10 years must be approved by the Dean for transfer. (Exception is made for registered nurse applicants.) Transfer of nursing credits from another accredited nursing program are considered on an individual basis.
