**Transfer Planning Guide – LIBERAL STUDIES (General Education)**  
 Use in tandem with Concordia general transfer guide

Below is a list of recommended courses for the student's first two years. You will notice the courses are divided into core areas (i.e. Humanities) and acceptable courses are listed. However, a specific major may require additional lower division courses as part of the student's major. Final decision regarding the acceptance of credit rests with Concordia University.

If a student completes the 37-41 semester hour package of the General Education Core of the Illinois Articulation Initiative, Concordia will not consider all Lower Level General Education Requirements completed. See a counselor or the CLC catalog for more information about the Illinois Articulation Initiative.

Graduation Requirements - special notes:

Non-Western/Third World Course Requirement:

One of the courses you choose within Humanities and Social Sciences should have an international or non-western emphasis. These courses are marked with an asterisk\*.

**II. Foreign Language**

If a student chooses to seek a Bachelor of Arts degree within CUC's College of Arts and Sciences, then he or she must complete either 6 semester hours of study in the same modern or classical language or complete 6 semester hours of two non-western courses. Please note that if the non-western option is chosen, only one course can double count as both a general education requirement and a non-western requirement.

If a student chooses to seek a Bachelor of Science degree within CUC's College of Arts and Sciences, then there is no foreign language requirement. However, the student will have to complete at least one non-western course.
