**Transfer Planning Guide – LIBERAL STUDIES (General Education)**

Below is a list of recommended courses for the student's first two years. You will notice the courses are divided into core areas (i.e. Humanities) and acceptable courses are listed. However, a specific major may require additional lower division courses as part of the student's major. Final decision regarding the acceptance of credit rests with Concordia University.

If a student completes the 37-41 semester hour package of the General Education Core of the Illinois Articulation Initiative, Concordia will not consider all Lower Level General Education Requirements completed.
