TRANSFER OPTIONS

- **Completed AA or AS degree:** All courses will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis. Having the AA/AS degree completed does not necessarily meet the General Education core at Marquette.
- **IAI GECC:** Marquette is NOT a participant in the IAI.
- **Completing some courses at CLC:** All courses will be evaluated on a course-by-course basis. Students with 12 hours of college credit completed are considered transfer students.

TRANSFER CREDITS

The maximum number of semester hours transferable from a community college is 64-67; they may not exceed half the number of semester hours required for graduation. Grades below "C" are not acceptable for transfer credit. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Transfer Student = 12 hrs or more
- All applicants must submit a high school transcript and students with less than 12 semester hours of college credit must also submit ACT/SAT scores.
- Marquette offers direct admission into an undergraduate college; therefore, admission review is conducted by the academic dean of the college to which the student is applying. Admission standards vary by undergraduate college and while there are no minimums or guarantees for admission, strong consideration is given to students who have demonstrated successful completion of college coursework, especially in disciplines pertaining to their desired area of study, with above a 2.5 gpa.
- Average GPA for transfer students is 3.3.

CALCULATION OF ADMISSION GPA

Grades below "C" are not acceptable for transfer credit but they will be calculated in determining the cumulative GPA. All attempts of repeated courses will be counted. Developmental coursework is not included when calculating an admission GPA.

APPLICATION

NURSING APPLICANTS: Transfer applications to the College of Nursing's traditional BSN program are no longer accepted as enrollment in this college is at capacity.

Applications are still being accepted to the RN-BSN-MSN degree completion program. Students applying to this degree completion program must hold an ADN/RN license prior to enrollment at Marquette.

Applications to this program are reviewed on a rolling basis following the deadline dates listed below.

ALL OTHER APPLICANTS: Admission review for all other majors is reviewed on a rolling basis. Applications completed after the priority deadlines listed below are reviewed as space permits.

Spring 2010: Dec. 1, 2009 postmark (application review begins in early September 2009)

Fall 2010: May 1, 2009 priority deadline (application review begins in mid-January 2010)

FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

The foreign language requirement for graduation is determined by the college/major the student is enrolled. It may range from 0 credits required to 16 credits (4 semesters) based upon the major and degree program being pursued.
