TRANSFER STUDENTS WITH 50+ SEMESTER HOURS of transferable coursework

(see reverse side for 24-49 hour transfer student admission criteria)

- 1) All courses in **bold** must be completed prior to 50+ semester hour level transfer; courses not in bold are recommended to be completed prior to transfer.
- 2) **FALL ADMISSION only**
- 3) Required courses and hours must be completed by the end of the spring semester - you may not complete course requirements or admissions hours during the summer prior to **fall** enrollment.
- 4) Major, University and General Education requirements total 60 hours.
- 5) The college will utilize a holistic review process which will assess the entire student record (academic performance, demonstrated analytical and critical thinking skills, leadership ability, work experience, and two essays completed with the application).
- 6) UIUC recommends Accountancy majors begin in summer semester if the MTH 222 is completed prior to transfer. Students will take the UIUC Econ Stats 173 in the summer semester at UIUC.

Major courses may be used to satisfy general education requirements provided they are on the appropriate general education list.

Required GPA: 3.0 (average GPA accepted is 3.8) - (due to competitive nature, a higher GPA is recommended)*

TRANSFER STUDENTS WITH 24-49 SEMESTER HOURS of transferable coursework

(see reverse side for 50+ hour transfer student admission criteria)

24-49 semester hour level transfer students will be evaluated on the following criteria:

1. Grades in college
2. Courses in college; must have a minimum of 24 transferable hours completed by time of entry. Students should choose from the UIUC General Education course requirements in order to meet the 24-59 hours of transferable credit required (see reverse side for General Education course requirements).
3. High school academics - required to submit official high school transcripts. Specific high school coursework requirements can be viewed at http://www.oar.uiuc.edu/future/apply/requirements_freshman.html. (Note: 95% of 2009 admitted freshmen were in the top 25% of their class.)
4. ACT or SAT – official exam scores are required for students who do not have 30 graded hours of transferable credit at the time of application; scores are recommended for sophomore transfers who have 30-59 graded hours of college credit. (Note: 76% of 2009 admitted freshmen had an ACT score of 27 or higher.)
5. Admission Essays (See application.)

Note: Required courses and hours must be completed by the end of the spring semester - you may not complete course requirements or admissions hours during the summer prior to **fall** enrollment.
