

# GRAYSLAKE CAMPUS

## ■ Crime Prevention

Because many crimes are preventable, CLC's Police Department encourages students and employees to get involved in protecting themselves and their property, and to take responsibility for their own safety and for the safety of others. Here are some of the ways that our department helps students and employees protect themselves:

- A 24-hour a day escort service by police personnel is available by request at the Grayslake campus.
  - In-house campus phones located throughout the Grayslake campus provide access to the police dispatcher and the department's enhanced emergency phone system, which immediately traces each on-campus call to provide the location of a caller in need, even if the call is disconnected.
  - After-hour access to college facilities is allowed only on an escorted, sign-in basis, by prior arrangement.
  - An electronic alarm system monitors a comprehensive campus-wide network of panic alarm and intrusion detection devices.
  - Emergency callboxes are located in student parking lots 2-5 and staff lots 1, 7 and 8, and six (6) outside main entrances. Push red button to activate the system.
- ## ■ Other Services
- The CLC Police Department also provides other support services to the college community. These include:
- Parking control and traffic enforcement and preparation of accident reports.
  - Motorist assistance with minor problems such as jump starts or recovering keys locked in cars.
  - Emergency first aid.
  - Testing and upkeep of fire prevention equipment and fire alarms.
  - Maintenance of the campus lost and found.

## ■ Campus Safety Procedures (all campuses)

**Alcoholic beverages:** Generally, the possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages is not permitted on campus. The exceptions are meetings or other functions where permits have been obtained in advance.

**Illegal substances:** The College of Lake County is committed to maintaining an environment of teaching and learning which is free of illicit drugs. Therefore, the college is a drug-free work and educational environment.

**Counseling:** Drug and alcohol counseling, rehabilitation and employee assistance programs are available through the In Touch program. Contact (847) 543-2056. Full details on CLC's compliance with the Federal Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act of 1989 (Public Law 101-226) are contained in "Rights and Responsibilities Concerning Alcohol and Substance Abuse at the College of Lake County," a pamphlet available from the In Touch office in room L227 on the Grayslake campus.

**Sex Offender Registration:** According to the Campus Sex Crime Prevention Act (Megan's Law):

1. Any registered sex offender who is enrolled as a student, carries on a vocation, or is employed at an institution of higher learning, must report their status as a student, carrying on a vocation, or as an employee to the local law enforcement authority in the jurisdiction with authority over the institution. The following are the CLC campus locations and associated law enforcement agencies for registration:
  - Grayslake Campus** – Grayslake Police Department
  - Lakeshore Campus** – Waukegan Police Department
  - Southlake Campus** – Vernon Hills Police Department
2. Upon receipt of this information, the local law enforcement agency will forward this information to the CLC Police Department (A151) where it will be compiled and made available to any member of the public, upon request. Juvenile information will not be made available.

**Sexual assault:** The College of Lake County has taken a proactive approach towards sexual assault awareness and prevention. For this reason, the following programs and procedures have been developed for the college community:

- Programs:** The college and LACASA (Lake County Council Against Sexual Assault) provide workshops throughout the year concerning date rape, self defense, etc. LACASA also provides an advocacy program.
- Procedures:** The following procedures should be followed by anyone who has been sexually assaulted:
  1. Contact CLC Police immediately at 5555 on a campus phone or (847) 543-2081. Also, Grayslake Police can be reached by dialing 911 or (847) 223-2341. Do not change clothes or wash if involved in a recent incident.
  2. Meet with personnel from health services, (847) 543-2064, or the counseling center, (847) 543-2060, for further assistance. On a TTY phone, dial (847) 223-0134.

Board Policy #933, Sexual Harassment, prohibits unwelcomed behavior of a sexual nature. Any staff member engaging in such prohibited behavior shall be subject to disciplinary action up to and including termination from the college, as determined by an administrative or board action.

**Weapons:** The unapproved possession, use or sale of firearms, ammunition, fireworks, major or minor explosives or any lethal weapon is forbidden on campus.

Violators of any of the above policies are subject to college discipline and criminal sanctions.

## ■ Reporting a Crime

To report a crime at the Grayslake campus, immediately dial 5555 on any campus phone. Phones are strategically located in the hallways of the main building and in other campus buildings. Emergency calls are automatically traced by the dispatcher, even when calls are not completed.

Campus phones are located next to a list of emergency phone numbers. Emergency phone numbers are also listed in the college staff and faculty phone directory. Call boxes are located in student lots 2-5 and staff lots 1, 7 and 8.

College policy states that, in order to aid in the prevention of further occurrences, all crimes shall be reported to the CLC Police Department or local police in a timely fashion. For the same reason, timely reports shall also be made to students and employees. When necessary, the identification of an individual volunteering information may be kept confidential.

## ■ Education

Education is an important part of preventing crime. The CLC Police Department makes ongoing efforts to educate the ever-changing college community about common sense precautions. Some of these include:

- Personal safety handouts included in the fall and spring new student orientation packets and the annual new student handbook.
- Crime prevention presentations and materials which are made available to groups and posted on campus.

- Campus emergency preparedness guidelines which are used as a resource for students and employees. These are found in classrooms and online.
- Personal safety programs offered through the activities office.
- Special crime alerts prepared and distributed as needed, selectively or throughout the campus.
- Current criminal reports and traffic accidents are briefly reported in each edition of the student newspaper.

## ■ Department Information

Your College of Lake County Police Department is a full-time, 24-hour, fully staffed campus safety team. In addition to fourteen (14) state-certified law enforcement officers, the department includes five (5) community service officers and three (3) support staff.

The state-certified officers are all trained through the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Board and have authority to report and investigate criminal activity as allowed by the State of Illinois.

Each officer has been trained in emergency medical procedures, first aid and CPR. Each is responsible for a full range of public safety services, including crime prevention, investigations, medical emergencies, fire emergencies, on-campus traffic accidents and enforcement of all state laws and campus regulations.

CLC's Police Department office works closely with other local public safety agencies to share information and give mutual assistance. The CLC Police Department is located in Room A151, on the northeast side of the main building, adjacent to the Anderson Court.

### To Report a Crime

Contact the reception desk on the first floor. Emergency help is available by dialing **911** or "0" from campus phones. Reception desk staff are trained in emergency assistance procedures. The CLC police office is located in Room S126a.

### Campus Security Precautions

Staff trained in emergency assistance procedures are on duty, and regular campus safety/security inspections are performed by police personnel. Additionally, officers are on duty during all day and evening hours and will provide escort service to vehicles, motorist assistance and law enforcement services.

## SOUTHLAKE CAMPUS

### To Report a Crime

Contact the reception desk at the main office in Room V130. Emergency help is available by dialing **911** or "0." The CLC police office is in Room V132.


### Campus Security Precautions

Staff trained in emergency assistance procedures are on duty, and regular campus safety/security inspections are performed by police personnel. Additionally, officers are on duty during evening hours and will provide escort service to vehicles, motorist assistance and law enforcement services.
