English as a Second Language Offered:

Yes, College of Lake County has an excellent intensive English language instruction program that is recognized as one of the top five community college English as a Second Language programs in the United States by the Council for Advancement of Adult Literacy. Upon admission, language proficiency test is administered to determine student's placement in one of three levels of instruction: intermediate, advanced, or transitional. No TOEFL scores or other tests required for program.

TOEFL Score or other tests required for placement in college level classes:

For the College's academic programs (no ESL), students must verify their language proficiency either by:

- a minimum score of 153 on the Language Skills section of the College of Lake County Academic Proficiency Test
- a minimum TOEFL score of 527 on the Paper Based Test, 197 on the Computer Based Test, 71 on the Internet Based Test
- completing the College of Lake County's ESL program with a grade of A in the Advanced or Transitional levels

International students can also demonstrate language proficiency by any of the following: ACT, Reading: Score of 17 or above and English: score of 17 or above. SAT, critical reading and writing scores of 450 or above.

Scholarship/Financial Aid Offered:

The College of Lake County offers scholarships to international students after they have completed at least one academic semester at The College of Lake County.

Campus Housing:

The College of Lake County does not provide on-campus housing. However, we assist you with finding off-campus housing such as: apartments, extended stay suites, and roommate shares. We also offer free airport pick-up services.
