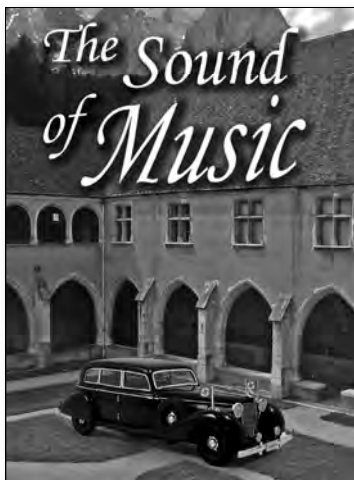

Based on a real family and their uplifting true events, The Sound of Music was the last collaboration between the brilliant Rodgers and Hammerstein. Set during the outbreak of WWII, the story unfolds as Maria is sent to be the new governess for seven unruly children. She discovers the family is run, in military style, by the seemingly cold-hearted Captain Von Trapp, a lonely widowed naval officer. Can Maria's warmth and good-hearted persistence win over the family? Can the family escape the growing power of the Third Reich? Songs like My Favourite Things, Do-Re-Mi, Edelweiss, Sixteen Going on Seventeen, and Climb Every Mountain, combine to make this one of the most memorable musicals ever written.

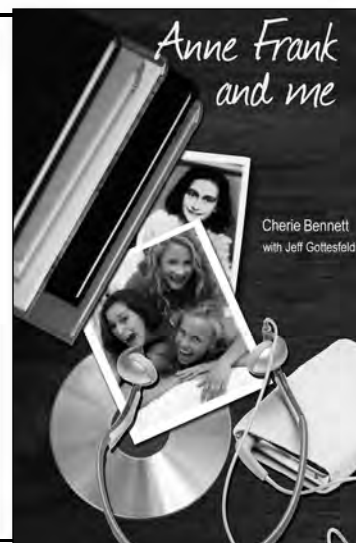
